Home to the birthplace of the first personal computer, BRiC is also the location of one of the biggest business deals of our time. A young Bill Gates secured a licensing deal with IBM on campus in the 1980s for Microsoft's operating system, known as "Project Chess."

## ABOUT ART ON BRIC WALLS


Art on BRiC Walls is an immersive self-guided tour of art exhibits lining our common area corridors to support our community and provide a platform for local artists to showcase and sell their work.

**ROCKET Sculpture** – Hubert Phipps' *Rocket* celebrates the heroics of modern engineering as also seen in Marcel Breuer's building, now called BRiC.

Palm Beach Watercolor Society – Experience the non-profit's exhibit Art From the Soul, which focuses on all forms of water media. Entrance: 4950.

**Zero Empty Spaces** - Zero Empty Spaces (ZES) is a rapidly growing affordable artist studio/vacancy management company that creates affordable artist studios in vacant spaces around the country where artists can create and collaborate. Studio entrance: 4950.

Lynn University NFT and Fine Art Exhibits – Created by the Eugene M. and Christine E. Lynn College of Communication and Design – witness one of the FIRST NFT exhibits created by a University – with works by students, faculty, staff and other works by renowned curators in the NFT space – and a fine art exhibit in the 4950 corridor. Entrance: 4950.

**Florida Atlantic University (FAU) Department of Visual Arts and Art History** – FAU Faculty Exhibition featuring the works of professors in the Fine Arts Program at FAU. Entrance 4950.

**Delray Art Warehouse** – *Multiple Visions* gathers a selection of 12 resident artists from Arts Warehouse in Delray Beach for an exhibition of paintings, drawings, and ceramics. Entrance: 5000

Stacy Daugherty – Macro photography capturing larger than life images of flora and wildlife at the entrance of BRiC's wellness center. Entrance: 5000

**Dorothy Gillespie Gallery** – In partnership with the Boca Raton Museum of Art, Dorothy Gillespie's works are pure visual pleasure; particularly Celestial Presence, an ambitious environment of more than 350 hand-painted and hand-formed aluminum starburst sculptures exploding with color and pattern, located in the JAVA coffee shop in the 4950 building.

**BRIC Collection** – At the conclusion of an exhibit, BRIC tenants vote on their favorite piece to become part of BRIC's permanent art collection. This exhibit represents the collection of tenant selected pieces. Entrance: 5000.

**Dreyfoos School of the Arts Student Art Exhibition** – A broad selection of works from students at Dreyfoos School of the Visual Arts including works on canvas, paper, and photography. Entrance: 5000.

**The Longest Hallway** – Featuring student artwork from Grandview Preparatory School, A.D. Henderson & FAU High School, Saint Andrew's School, Fusion Academy, and Spanish River Christian School. Entrance: 4950.

Women in the Visual Arts – A juried collection of art from female artists throughout Palm Beach. Entrance: 4950.

**BRIC Tenant Exhibition** – Showcasing the creative talent of our BRIC tenants. Entrance: 5000.
